BYLAW NO.4

At a special session held in Portage du Fort on the 27th day of December, 1856, at the hour of ten of the clock A.M., at which meeting are present P.F. Fox, mayor of Litchfield, acting as warden (W.L. Gray, warden, being absent), and the following county councillors:

- F.X. Bastien mayor of Calumet Island
- Robert Shirley mayor of Bristol
- George Bryson mayor of Mansfield
- John Dale mayor of Clarendon

The secretary-treasurer being also present.

Moved by Robert Shirley, seconded by George Bryson and resolved that the following bylaw be passed to extend the time of visit of the county superintendent:

That whereas it appears to this council that the time allowed by law for the superintendent to make his semi-annual visits is altogether too short, it is therefore expedient and it is hereby enacted that the time be extended 40 days, and that the time for making his reports to the local council be also extended in like proportion.

Carried unanimously.
