BYLAW NO.24

At a general quarterly session held in Havelock on Wednesday the 14th day of March, 1871, at which meeting are present His Worship Warden William O'Meara, mayor of Portage du Fort, and the following county councillors:

- Walter Russell mayor of Bristol
- William McDowell mayor of Clarendon
- Simon McNally mayor of Calumet Island
- George Palmer mayor of Leslie
- William Logue mayor of Onslow
- John F. Coghlan mayor of Waltham
- Terence Duff mayor of Allumette Island
- Alexander Proudfoot mayor of Mansfield
- Thomas McVeagh mayor of Litchfield
- James McCool mayor of Chichester

forming a quorum of council. The secretary-treasurer being also present.

The said council doth hereby ordain and make the following bylaw:

"A bylaw to establish the tariff of charges of the Calumet ferry."

It is hereby enacted that the tariff of the Calumet ferry be in future as follows:

- each single person on foot 2@ each way
- each waggon load of any commodity 3@ each way
- each ? of any commodity 2@ each way
- each waggon with two horses or a ? and ox or with oxen 6@ each way.

Between the hours of four of the clock in the morning and ten of the clock at night and between the hours of 10 of the clock at night and four of the clock in the morning, it shall be double the above tariff, except in the cases of when parties are going far as medical attendance in which cases the day tariff shall be above collectable.
